Plans and Activities

We have been very busy making the final preparations for BCD. We would like to thank all those who have helped in this effort thus far, and would encourage other members to volunteer their services. Please contact either Lin or me at 301-831-5300 during the day, or in the evening at 301-831-6975 or 301-845-2567. We will find a job for vou!

Below is a summary of BCD activities to date:

- 1. Pre-registration Update: To date we have about 103 Car Entrants and 8 Vendors. I receive about 4 phone calls and 2 e-mails per day on average, which should continue to bring the count higher. With drive-ins allowed, we can expect the total numbers to increase further, especially if the weather cooperates.
- 2. Band Booster Help: We have successfully enrolled the help of the Linganore High School Band Boosters for BCD. Their representative, Diane Purcell has assured me that they will provide about 20 people (most will be adults who are anxious to see the cars!) to help with various aspects of the show. They will be used primarily for managing traffic flow, spectator parking, gate keeping, sign posting, and other areas as needed.
- 3. Meeting at Smokey Glen Farm: On Thursday May 22, Charley Howard, Diane Purcell, and I met with Jim Green, our event manger to discuss the final preparations for BCD. We walked the field and agreed we would arrange the cars and vendors in basically the same locations we had used last year. SGF has also agreed to provide us with a free 40' x 40' tent, set-up in the vendor area to serve as our regalia tent. Having a tent available will be a very useful commodity. It will also relieve us of the burden of setting up and breaking down a large, cumbersome tent.
- 4. Advertising: To date, we have advertised BCD in over 20 advertising media. This

targeted advertising campaign has included major automotive magazines and car club newsletters. We also plan to notify a number of the local newspapers one week before the event in order to increase our exposure to the general public. In addition, SGF has agreed to post a BCD press release in the full series of Gazette Newspaper throughout the area as free service to us. This will include a ¼ page ad free of charge!

- 5. Club Support: We expect car club support again this year for BCD. The MG Car Club, DC Centre has agreed to have their people help with parking the MG's. The Capital Triumph Register expects to have people available for car parking, and the Capital Mini Register has also expressed an interest in helping on the show field as well. Having the local car clubs play a more active role in BCD under our direction will greatly relieve the burden on our club for running the show, and promote a sense of cooperation among the clubs.
- 6. Set-up Eve. Before: We've made arrangements to begin setting up the field on Saturday evening from 6:30 until dusk. This should give us about 2.5 hours of daylight to lay out the field, post signs, set up cones, etc. We hope to have a good portion of the set up work done on the night before. This will allow us to better focus on other issues that will arise on Sunday morning. Please contact us if you plan to be at SGF on Saturday night to help with the set-up.
- 7. Insurance for BCD: Our insurance policy with JC Taylor has been obtained from the NEMGTR and approved. A copy is now on file.
- 8. First Aid Services: The Montgomery County First Aid Unit will be set up in the covered vendor area and will provide first aid service for the show.
- 9. Security: Officer Kim Jones from the Gaithersburg Police Department will be on hand for security services from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm.
- 10. Stuffing Party: The stuffing party is planned for Sunday June 8, at the Holmlund's at 1:00 PM. We could use about

10 people to help prepare the packets for the show participants. Please contact Ron or Gwen directly to confirm your attendance and for directions to their home.

Your input is welcome. Thanks again to all for your support and help!
