

# Jumping In With Both Feet --- Restoration of My 1949 MGTC --- Installment Nr 14 Reporting Progress on Steve Woodall's 1949 MGTC

Since the FALL 2017 edition of The Square Rigger, steady progress has continued. Most importantly, with the applied expertise of my Chief Engineer and Restoration Architect, Charlie Adams, the installation of the totally new wiring harness and new dashboard is almost complete. The beautiful new wiring has been tested for continuity, all ground wires are in place, and the fuel system has been lit off successfully. The headlamps and side lamps have been rebuilt, rewired and successfully tested. The new chrome badge bar has been put together, and the rebuilt horn and the fog lamp have been tested. The initial test of engine light off found the engine turning over properly, but "no spark" --- we suspect we'll need to replace the electronic ignition bits, which will be done first thing when we get back to work in early January 2018. I have the spare electronic ignition kit in hand, as well as the original "regular" points assembly handy, if needed.






Brand New Wiring - back of the New Dash Board

The most difficult to install new upholstery has been completed in the rear of the tub --- the wheel well covers, rear edge trim, and the side curtain compartment lining and new door --- and the rest is all ready to install. In fact, once the wiring is fully completed and tested, the car will be ready to reassemble!

The new carpeting, piping, and totally new leather interior panels will go in, then the newly re-chromed windshield frame will be assembled & installed. As you can see in the picture below, the mounts for the two new Brooklands Screens are already installed on the dash board. Finally, the fenders, bonnet, running boards, and cowl will be bolted on --- and we'll have a nearly completed car.

At that point --- coming soon --- we'll need to install the new black canvas hood (top), and fit the new black canvas covers for the side curtains. Then, we'll replace the old, worn tires with new ones --- not yet purchased. I am still leaning towards the Blockley tires.

However, the end is clearly in sight! Important to remember --- this restoration effort began with initial disassembly in November of 2013. *Nothing* is ever as simple as it seems! ": -)


### **Tech Notes, January 2018**

#### MG TD and TF Cowl Rubber

I'm replacing a cowl rubber and learned that an improved version is available.

If you have replaced this rubber in recent years, you may have used the product which is in the shape of a "bird's beak," and which does not lay flat on the scuttle. Paul Jennings of Oklahoma provided us with the following drawing showing the differences. According to Paul, Brown and Gammons offers cowl rubber that is similar in shape to the original and will lay flat.



#### **MG Leaf Springs**

Some of the leaf springs on the market today are not providing the correct ride height and suppleness we expect on our cars. Most recently, I put a new set of springs on an MGA, and its ride height was easily over 1½ inches too high. The car also rode hard. The solution was to find and install a set of original springs. Recently, I learned that Jones Springs of England is making MG leaf springs with the same ratings as those from the factory, and will be giving theirs a try at the next opportunity. MG TC for Sale

On January 5<sup>th</sup>, I looked over this 1949 MG TC, which is for sale in Manassas. I spotted it on Craigslist.

Overall, this is a nice car needing mechanical restoration. The owner said its matching numbers, but the bonnet latches were stuck so I couldn't verify this.

The owner's father bought the car in England in 1963, and kept it in Florida for many years. Earlier history is not known. No maintenance history is available. Nevertheless, the car has had effort put into it over the years.

The body is straight and the paint is fairly good. Certainly presentable. The undersides of the fenders were not done when the car was last painted, and are painted black. There is some light rust under the car, but overall the body is quite nice. The doors sag a little, due it appears, to be worn hinges. The passenger door handle does not operate the latch. The chrome is a bit dull and in fair condition.

The bonnet is loose on the body--the hinge end pieces are not screwed down. The engine compartment is presentable looking through the louvers, but I could not get a good look at the carbs.

The black interior is in good or better condition except for the carpet. Seats are back leather. The top frame is off the car, and side curtains are present but cloudy and discolored.

The battery was dead and the engine has not run in some years. The tires are dry rotted and near bald. The brake

and clutch pedals flop left and right so the bushings need replaced. I expect the suspension rubber needs replaced. The brake pedal went to the floor, and the master cylinder is damp. The handbrake does work. Typical TC steering feel at rest.

I'm going to help the owner by working on starting the car after doing the important prep work. Perhaps I'll then be able to drive it a short distance.
