VIRGINIA BEACH MINI-GOF IS ON! - REGISTRATION & INFORMATION

The MINI-GOF (Gathering of the Faithful) for the NEMGTR Chesapeake Chapter in Virginia Beach on April 30 - May 2, 2020 is on! It will be based at the Founders Inn in Virginia Beach. The Inn says "Our beautifully landscaped 26-acre resort and spa location gives guests the feeling of an oasis without compromising proximity. The Inn and Conference Center features include: 240 guestrooms, our full-service Flowering Almond Spa, the award-winning Swan Terrace Grill Restaurant, tennis courts, and three (3) swimming pools."

Room rates are \$139 a night. There will be reserved parking lots for MGs and trailers with a security patrol. See below * for more info on the Founders. The Inn has taken significant precautions to prevent the spread of the virus, including spreading us out at dinner and a constant cleaning/sanitation program.

The schedule of events includes a Friday evening visit with buffet dinner and beverages at a local collector's 25 car collection (all exceptional) at his private display building just blocks from the shorefront in Virginia Beach. You could visit the boardwalk before or after this event. This is a large showroom, and we will be able to spread out.

Saturday AM we will visit the Virginia Beach Military Aviation Museum (militaryaviationmuseum.org) which includes over 60 flyable vintage airplanes: 17 from WWI and 44 from WWII in several hangers. There will also be rides in biplanes (1941 Stearman or 1989 Waco YMF5) for those signing up in advance.

In the afternoon we will visit the Big Ugly brewery in Chesapeake (biguglybrewing.com) for our car display and popular voting for the MG Ts we admire most. This is a very popular location, and our display will be on their front lawn. Their beers have won many awards locally and nationally. Registration includes two complimentary beers. Box lunches from Panera Bread will be provided (please see registration form).

Saturday evening we will have our buffet dinner at the lovely Founders private dining room with a cash bar. The Founders has excellent food. Awards will be presented (must be registered to get an award).

The buffet dinner includes:

Caesar salad
Garlic mashed potatoes
Southern style green beans
Slow roasted pork loin, pan seared Atlantic salmon, or chicken breast roulade
Fresh strawberry layered cake or Founders Inn traditional bread pudding

The Sunday brunch (not included in the registration fee) at Founders is probably the best in the area. There will be a hospitality room throughout the weekend at the Founders with beer/wine/soda/water/munchies.

How much driving do we do?

The total trip distances have ranged between 800-1200 miles. We do it in small daily bites of something between 40 and 120 miles. Our cars are old, but generally mechanically sound. Moving South from 'Old Virginny' to Hilton Head Island, SC

This is the tale, briefly told, of the Woodall's leaving their home of over 21 years in Fairfax Station, Virginia to move south to the "low country" of South Carolina, to a genuine "destination" --- Hilton Head Island. The several purposes of our move included: being closer to kids and grandkids, living in Greenville, SC ("up country"); to be below the snow belt and leave behind bitter cold, icy winters; and, to reduce our annually growing burden of performing the upkeep and maintenance on our beautiful property --- home, carriage house, lawn, bushes, pool, gazebo, hot tub, and all else. Our choice of Hilton Head Island was based on memories of several past summer "beach weeks" with the kids and grandkids --- we felt very comfortable and "at home" there, close to the sea and the miles and miles of beautiful beaches. And, our many fond memories from two of our several tours of sea duty, while based in nearby Charleston, SC --- "low country" memories from our early Navy days.

From the beginning, our timing was "perfect!" After driving south in early March of 2020 to do some initial house hunting and exploring in Hilton Head Island and general vicinity, we returned to VA on the 12th of March, On Friday, the

13th of March (an auspicious date, for sure), we signed a contract with a realtor to sell our home and property. *THAT VERY AFTERNOON*, our benevolent Governor, Lord "Blackface" Northam, decided to close the state down for the dreaded COVID-19 China Virus. Not helpful! Could it have been --- "Friday, the 13th?"

For the first few months of the lockdown, we could not even have people over to see the house. "Mask up!" and "Wash your hands again!" time had begun. We spent hours and hours in the process of downsizing --- not helped at all by the China Virus. Nobody wanted old books, so they literally had to be thrown away. Nobody wanted our old furniture. Many "things" were simply given or thrown away. We knew we were going from three stories of house and the two-story Carriage House to a much smaller, one-story home.

Hardest of all the downsizing, we had to sell some of our cars, since we could not move them all --- no place to keep them in SC! As a part of preparing for our move south, we sold the 1924 Model T Ford Tudor, the 1949 Triumph 2000, and the 1996 BMW Z-3. We shipped our 2008 BMW 528xi to our kids in Greenville. Hardest of all, I sold my 1934 MGPA, which I had owned and loved since 1977. We decided to keep and move with us our 1949 MGTC, the 1962 MGA 1600 Mk II and "MGA" trailer, and the 1999 Jaguar XK-8.

More happily, later in the summer, we were able to get interested buyers in to see the house, and eventually, we found the right family to become the new owners of 8180 Cottage Rose Court! We finally closed on the sale of our home on the 11th of September 2020 (another auspicious date!), and on the morning of 18th of September, we lined up and loaded the three remaining cars and the little "MGA" trailer into a large, covered car transport, and headed south for the "low country." See the three cars and small trailer to be moved south lined up on Thornbush Drive, an adjacent Roseland Estates street!

Arriving that evening, we spent our first night in the Marriott Hotel, right on the beach at Hilton Head Island. On the morning of the 19th of September, we met the car transport in nearby Beaufort, SC, where we unloaded the cars and trailer. We stored them in three different, previously rented storage garages, where they were to remain until October. That very morning, after assuring ourselves that the cars were safe, we drove back to Hilton Head Island to meet with a "long-term rental" Realtor ("long term" being six months or longer, as compared to a Realtor who does shorter, more variable summer vacation rentals!), who showed us a home we could rent, while subsequently starting house hunting for our own new SC home. Happily, the rental home was a perfect for us, and we agreed to sign the papers immediately. Because the rental home was not going to be available for us to move in until 15 October, we remained for a blissful month in the Marriott Hotel on the beach, alternating between house hunting, trying out new restaurants, walking on the beach, and basic vacationing. We found South Carolina in general, and Hilton Head Island in particular, to be much more relaxed than VA about China Virus issues, and much more open. Restaurants were then and still are essentially open – go in with a mask, sit down at your table, and take the blasted things off!

We moved into our rental home at 22 Timber Marsh Lane on Hilton Head Island (in the Palmetto Hall Plantation neighborhood) on the 15th of October, and shortly thereafter, drove each of the cars from the storage garages in Beaufort, SC to their new home on Hilton Head Island. However, for the first time in ages, our grocery-mobile, the MB ML500, had to live outdoors. We quickly got settled in our new, rented, "downsized" home. We were able to host the kids and grandkids for Thanksgiving, and spent Christmas time with them in Greenville, SC (a much shorter drive now than from Fairfax Station, VA).

Once settled in Timber Marsh Lane, we began house hunting in earnest. With the help of a really terrific Realtor, we found the exact home we were looking for. Knowing what features we were looking for, including a roomy, three-car garage, he showed us "our" home on the 4th of January 2021, before it even went on the market. We immediately loved it! We signed contractual papers that very afternoon, taking off the market before ever being listed! Our new home is at 11 Mead Lane, on Hilton Head Island, in the Indigo Run neighborhood.

Note that the majority of homes on Hilton Head Island are located in gated communities, each with a different name and history. Our rental home is in the Palmetto Hall Plantation neighborhood. As of Friday, the 26th of March, the very day I am finishing this article, we will begin moving into our new home at 11 Mead Lane, in the Indigo Hall neighborhood. See pictures! As you can see from the realtor.com web site, we'll have a large three-car garage, a master bedroom with its own screened-in porch, two guest rooms, a small swimming pool, and location on a lake, complete with our very own alligators. We hope to be totally moved in and mostly settled by the end of April!




